Fundamental British Values

Across the Federation our way of working, policies and procedures are all consistent with the Fundamental British Values defined by the Government as:

- Democracy how citizens can influence decision-making through their elected representatives or their own lawful actions
- The Rule of Law the equal treatment of everyone using the same framework of rules and regulations
- **Individual Liberty** the respect for our freedoms as individuals and responsibilities they imply plus understanding of the circumstances where freedoms may be restricted for the good of all
- Mutual Respect and Tolerance for those of different faiths and beliefs treating each other as we would hope we would be treated ourselves

Across the Federation you will develop an understanding of these values through work in lessons, enrichment opportunities and Federation events. Examples are outlined below:
