MFL teacher to support across the whole school for 1 day per week. This allows the class teacher s to provide one to one support and intensive group support to pupils within their classes.	This has allowed all teachers to be able to implement 1:1 support for pupils in their classes. This has meant that interventions have been more targeted and more easily monitored by the class teacher. This has enhanced the provision made across the whole school. One to one support and small group learning support for phonics, reading and maths across KS1.	FSM pupils in years R,1&2 have received additional support through intensive small group work in reading, phonics and maths. These sessions have focused on specific areas and have reinforced class teaching. They have increased progress and allowed all pupils involved to make good progress.	£5,668
Intensive small group learning support in literacy, reading and maths across KS2	FSM pupils in KS2 have received additional support in literacy, reading and maths. All pupils have improved their skills and attainment in all areas. Confidence and self-esteem has increased. During assessment	£6,906

Social skills groups.	Social skills, friendship and emotional literacy groups have been run across the school this year. This has allowed children to explore their emotions and develop and extend their social skills. It has boosted their confidence, self-esteem and well-being.	1 hour per wk HLTA £620
ELSA Training	A member of staff has completed ELSA training and is now able to provide individual ELSA sessions. These allow children to explore and resolve emotional and social issues. The ELSA also works with small groups with a Circle of Friends type approach. She also takes a group of 4 pupils daily for Maths and Literacy work while incorporating ELSA and Nurture principles. This has had a very positive impact on the pupils involved, but has also had a very positive impact on the Teaching and Learning of the remainder of the class.	£450
Support with educational trips and after school clubs.	This has allowed all pupils to be able to fully access the curriculum and benefit from the extra curricular activities which are provided by the school.	(50% of PGL for 3 PP children) £237
Provision of break time tuck	This has ensured that all pupils are able to access tuck if they wish. This has enhanced pupil well-being.	£100
Provision of Play Therapy	Certain pupils have been identified as requiring emotional support. The Play Therapy has allowed them to explore their issues and emotions in a safe and secure environment.	£535

Provision of Parenting support	<p>Certain pupils and their families have been identified as requiring parenting support. This support has been delivered in the home and has involved the whole family. This support has had positive effects on the behaviour of the children in school and at home and has enhanced family life and increased the confidence of the parents involved.</p>	£1,070
Provision of Behavioural support in school.	<p>The dynamics of some classes has been difficult this year. Support was provided to aid behaviour management with positive results. As a result the classrooms have become calmer which in turn has allowed increased teaching and learning to take place.</p> <p>Staff have had additional training in aspects of positive behaviour management which has led to more effective and consistent implementation and greater skills in de-fusing confrontational situations.</p>	£200
