PE & SPORTS PREMIUM PROPOSED PLAN 2017 / 2018

What is the Primary PE and Sports Premium?

In March 2013 the Government announced that it was to provide additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/2014, 2014/2015 and 2015/16 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in Primary schools in England - The Primary PE & Sport Premium. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - is allocated to primary school headteachers. The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. In the Autumn Statement 2013, the Chancellor, George Osborne, announced an additional year's £150m extended funding, taking the total investment to the end of the 2016 academic year. On 6th February 2014 the Prime Minister, David Cameron committed to continue the funding for the Primary PE & Sport Premium until 2020.

Purpose of funding:

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and Sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

The four objectives of the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding are:

1. To improve the quality of existing PE teaching through continuing professional learning in PE for generalists, so that all primary pupils improve their health, skills and physical literacy, and have broader exposure to a range of sports.
2. To increase participation levels in competitive sport and healthy activity of pupils, and maintain these into adolescence.
3. To increase the quality of initial teacher training in PE and sport, and to promote PE specialisation in primary level workforce.
4. Schools understand and value the benefits of high quality PE and sport, including its use as a tool for whole school improvement.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

1. Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE.
2. Supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional (Change4Life) clubs.
3. Paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
4. Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport.
5. Running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games.
6. Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport.
7. Providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs.
8. Maintaining and purchasing equipment and resources.

What will we use it for?	Cost:	Impact:
Purchasing of equipment	£4,000	Increased quality and range of equipment for PE sessions, training and competitive sport.
Entry and membership fees / SGO programme subscription	£300	Maintaining the range and level of sports available to our children as extra-curricular and competitive sports.
Provision of extra-curricular clubs	£1,000	Increased range and number of after school clubs activities available to all ages.
Continuous Professional Development	£1,500	Increased quality and range delivered within the curriculum and extra-curricular sessions.
External coaching/teachers	£1,650	Specialists used to increase student knowledge and enjoyment in a range of activities and allowing current teachers to learn the necessary skills.
Increasing opportunities to participate in inter-school competitive events	£2,000	Allowing children the opportunity to compete against other school in a variety of locations, both on and off the Island. This will involve travel to events during school hours and those involving whole year groups
Specialist Internal teaching of PE	£5,600	PE specialist with in-depth training over a number of years to work alongside teachers/teaching assistants to promote a more diverse & quality sports curriculum.
Additional "booster" swimming (in addition to curriculum allocation)	£1,000	Identified children who do not have water safety/ swimming to be competent, and to aid those at risk of not getting 25M at KS2
Sports Crew Uniform	£100	Sports crew to coach/ marshal/ referee children at break /Lunch. Sports crew to support in PE sessions at inter-school sporting events.

Golden Mile initiative	£800	All individual children, classes and school can be evaluated and monitored as to additional running/athletic activities during the school day. Our aim to inspire and encourage participants with a focus on fun, rewarding personal achievement, raising money and healthy competition. This also includes parental involvement, which will increase sustainability of PE and frequency of exercise as per government recommendations.

Future projects if funding is still available:
<p>Sustainability of some of the aspects above after review from this year.</p> <p>New equipment and training to develop and broaden activities that the children would not normally participate in such as Performing arts, trampolining water sports, archery, martial arts, cycling etc. Costs to be confirmed.</p> <p>Monitoring and whole school development. Curriculum Lead monitoring release time. Time to meet with Sports organising crew and team sports captains on a weekly basis to arrange house points and intra sports events. Improve standards in sport.
