After we got off of the bus, we went into our groups. Inside the zoo, we listened to Tracy (our guide).

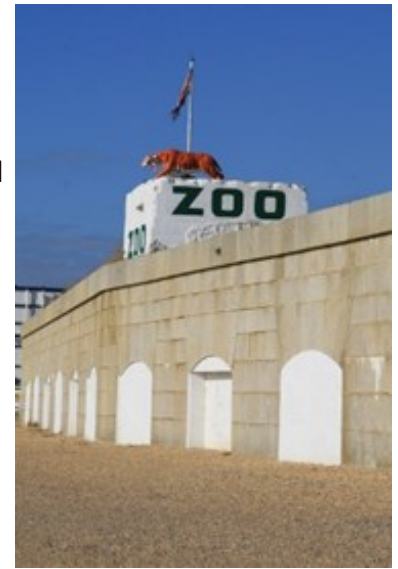
Tracy was talking to us about the plan of the day. Then we went around the zoo, to see the different animals and collect our stamps.
