Dear Parents/Carers,

We were all very proud of the way the children behaved when the school photos were taking place. They were all so sensible and respectful when moving around the school. Reception had not been out of their classroom before the photos and many of the year 6 pupils had not been in the main school building.

As we continue to be vigilant could I ask that no personal items come into school from home, unfortunately, or not, this does include football and Lego cards as well as umbrellas and sunglasses. If your child has something they particularly want to share with their class please take a photo and upload it to class Dojo or Tapestry.

Thank you to all of you for maintaining social distancing as best you can at pick-up time. I know that space is limited but we really do appreciate your efforts.

As the weather becomes less favourable we will be operating a shuttle system some mornings to reduce the amount of time the children are standing on the field. When a significant group from one class has arrived a member of the classroom staff will take them to the classroom. A second member of staff will wait for the remaining children.

Can I just remind you of the starting times for each key stage as we have an increasing number of children arriving very early and having to wait for a considerable length of time.
